The number of drugs used and high age of patients are important risk factors for adverse drug effects [3] that may cause hospital admission [4-6] .

Electroconvulsive therapy, also called ECT, is a type of shock therapy that may be used in the elderly. An elderly person may be defined as someone who is 60 years of age or older. ECT is a treatment where a small electric shock is sent to your brain to make a seizure (convulsion).

This makes elderly patients much more susceptible to fluid overload.³In addition, blunted baroreflexes make geriatric patients less able to respond normally to hypovolemia and much more susceptible to orthostatic hypotension with drug therapy.⁴Taken together, these alterations in the cardiovascular system can make elderly patients more sensitive to fluid shifts and blood loss.

The use of antimuscarinic drugs is common in the management of the overactive bladder (OAB).
